#### **Transportation improvements begin at Spencer Road and Premier Parkway intersection**

A transportation improvement project began on Sept. 8, at the intersection of Spencer Road and Premier Parkway.

Drivers should be prepared for intermittent lane closures during construction. Completion is expected in spring 2021.

Improvements will include additional turn lanes, a median, new traffic signal, drainage improvements, a crosswalk, and a trail connection. New fiber cable also will be installed along Spencer and Premier to improve communications for the area. The project, which is funded by the St. Charles County transportation sales tax, will improve both the operation of the intersection and the capacity to handle increased traffic as Premier 370 Business Park continues to develop.

Drivers are asked to use caution while traveling through this area and to obey traffic signs.

### Amid Pandemic, St. Charles Jewish Community to hold 'Rosh Hashanah in the Park'

With the High Holidays approaching and his wife, Bassy. "This year, that means expanding COVID-19 creating difficulties for many in joining a traditional synagogue service, the St. Charles Jewish Community will hold an outdoor Rosh Hashanah service on Sunday, Sept. 20 at 11 a.m. at Veterans Tribute Park. Dubbed "Rosh Hashanah in the Park," the service is open to all, with no membership or affiliation required.

Inspired by the Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson, of righteous memory's shofar campaign which began in 1953, the service will include the sounding of the shofar, which is central to the observance of Rosh Hashanah, as well as tashlich, an ancient practice that is customarily performed on the first day of the holiday.

"Our goal is to lower the barriers of entry, and to encourage each and every Jewish person in St. Charles County to actively participate in the observances of Rosh Hashanah - safely and joyfully," said Rabbi Chaim Landa, who directs the Chabad Jewish Center of St. Charles County together with

our offerings and bringing our Rosh Hashanah services outdoors."

According to the most recent demographic study sponsored by the Jewish Federation of St. Louis an estimated 5,800 of the region's 61,000 Jews live in St. Charles County.

The 30-minute service will include the sounding of the shofar as well as selected prayers from the High Holiday liturgy. While not a substitute for the complete Rosh Hashanah prayer service, the service will enable everyone to hear the shofar, and bring a heightened sense of community during this difficult time. To ensure the wellbeing of participants, those present at the event will be asked to wear masks, and stay six feet apart from people not living in the same household.
